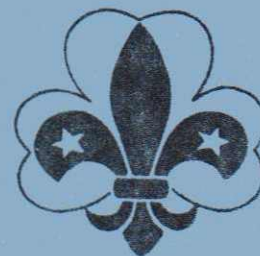

I had just gone to press with the last issue of MAMOOK PAPA when I learned of the formation of the 20th Canadian B.-P. Guild in London, Ontario. So a belated and happy welcome to the 20th Canadian B.-P. Guild, London.

Following is the report I prepared for the May meeting of the National Council, Boy Scouts of Canada:

*"The Canadian Council of B.-P. Guilds is pleased to advise of the formation of four new B.-P. Guilds in Canada, one in Ontario at London and three in British Columbia, one in Abbotsford and two in Vancouver. This will bring our membership well over the 500 mark.*

*Most, if not all, Guilds were active during Scout-Guide Week and have extensive plans for the coming year.*

*The Canadian Council of B.-P. Guilds has prepared a brochure "Your Introduction to the B.-P. Guilds in Canada" which will be available shortly. We would be pleased to send supplies to anyone wishing copies.*

*Plans are proceeding for members to attend the 16th General Assembly of the International Fellowship of Former Scouts and Guides to be held in Christchurch, New Zealand in February 1985.*

*The Canadian Council has offered the Guilds assistance in any way possible at the National Staff Conference to be held in June of this year at the University of British Columbia."*

With respect to the National Staff Conference, the Guilds have been asked to welcome members at the airport and residence as well as help transport the members from and to the airport. It is a good opportunity for the B.-P. Guild to be SEEN and HELP. Hopefully, this will stimulate the assistance in forming new Guilds in other parts of Canada.

Your Canadian Council has prepared and mailed to your secretary a supply of brochures - "Your Introduction to the B.-P. Guild in Canada". These will help you spread the word of the B.-P. Guild and hopefully increase our membership, our Guilds, and bring more assistance to Scouting. I would like to thank the B.C.-Yukon Council of Boy Scouts who prepared the final copy and bore the expense of printing.

I am sure you would like to know how we made out in our donations to the IFOFSAG 30th Anniversary Project in Penang. We were able to send Brussels \$644.00 made

up of donations received from the Hospitality Centre at WJ '83, the B.C. Council of B.-P. Guilds, the Canadian Council of B.-P. Guilds, the 1st, 4th, 9th, 12th and 14th Guilds. The 4th Guild had been given a picture by Dr. V. Fanderlik, a member of the Central Guild. It was framed by a member of the 4th and raised money for the Project by a Dutch Auction at the February gathering of local Guilds sponsored by the 13th Guild in North Vancouver. Brussels has acknowledged to each Guild its contribution to the Project.

Tom Collins obtained for some of you the IFOFSAG flag and was able to refund you some money. They cost \$33.00. They are Dranylon in United Nations Blue field with the IFOFSAG crest in full colors - size 1 x 1½ metres.

While speaking of costs, I must tell you that the name plates have gone up again in price. They will be \$5.00 each from now on. They are well done and most attractive so get yours before price increases more.

For those of you who have your personal copy of the Fellowship Bulletin, I wish to advise that for 1985 the cost will be \$4.00. We will remind you again in the fall when it is time to re-order.

We have received from the World Scouting Foundation their Biennial Report 1981-1983 and the first report of the Baden-Powell World Fellowship. The Foundation's sole purpose is to generate and promote the financial support for the World Organization of the Scout Movement. The Fellowship has been founded to celebrate the 75th Anniversary. If you wish more information or to see these reports, please do not hesitate to let me know.

For those of you who are thinking away ahead to the GA in Great Britain in 1987, the date has been altered to July 20-25. The venue will be the University of Warwick at Coventry - the parade route of Lady Godiva - better known for its absolutely beautiful modern cathedral.

I have been receiving enquiries, about the Stamp Bank. Just to review: stamps should be soaked from their backing, sorted into values and if large quantities of one value further sorted into issues. They should be packaged, including a self-addressed card or envelope and sent to: STAMP BANK, Box 49, Kalbakken, N-Oslo 9, Norway.

Short News from the IFOFSAG Council advised that a Stamp Bank information leaflet will soon be issued; a small recruiting leaflet is going to be printed very soon; work is going on for a more attractive brochure describing the guild movement; the WAGGGS representation on the Council indicated events planned for the Year of the Youth in 1985; report from the World Conference of the Boy Scouts also emphasized the activities planned for the Year of the Youth, especially a friendship programme between scouts from developing and industrialized countries. Council will find out in what way IFOFSAG can contribute. The annual IFOFSAG donation to the World Scout Bureau will be used for participation of some African Scouter in the Cub Scout Seminar in Upper Volta. WAGGGS donation is to be divided between national associations in Africa, Asia and the Western Hemisphere to enable them to attend the World Conference in New York, and the U.S. Wilson Scholarship Grant 1984 has been given to Graciela Varin of Uruguay.
