The 61st B-P Guild (Saint John) wishes to advise on the passing of our member Harold Fanjoy , Harold was the first guildmaster of our newly formed B-P Guild. He was very active in scouting and at the time of his passing was working to form a new scout troop at his church. He was with a scouting contingent that went to a world jamboree in England , visiting Gillwell Park and Scotland and had lots of memories to pass on to the members. Harold was also a Queen's Scouter. Harold also gave a hand at local camporees, and did give his time to being at Camp Holderville. He will be missed at our roundtable monthly meetings.

Harold was interested in genealogy, gardening and travelling. He also served admirably as a member of the New Brunswick legislature.

At the funeral the 61st B-P Guild formed an honour guard outside the church as a final respect to him. He is survived by his wife Marylin, his two sons, and grandchildren. He was cremated at the wishes of his family.



### Charles W. ( Charlie ) Nash

Charlie Nash (48th B-P Guild - West Vancouver) started his Scouting career in 1927 at age 10, and apart from his service in

the RCAF as a bomber pilot in Britain during WW2, he was continuously involved until his "Going Home" on April 20th 2008. He served in many distinguished leadership capacities including BC Provincial President, Victoria Regional President, Vancouver Coast Region Vice-President, National Executive and Council, BC Provincial Commissioner, and in a full slate of Scouter roles including many Gilwells as instructor.

He was awarded the Silver Acorn in 1969, Bar to the Silver Acorn in 1997, Scout Centennial Medal on his 90th Birthday in 2007, and the Queens Silver Jubilee Medal. As Chair of the Camp Byng Development Business & Industry section. He raised over \$100,000 in 1978.

Charlie had a successful and busy career retiring as V-P of BC Hydro in 1981. He then served as Chair of Shaughnessy Hospital, Shaughnessy Hospital Foundation, University Hospital Board, and Holy Family Hospital. He was also International Advisor and member of the Board of CESO. He was a grad of UBC ( BASc Mech Engineering ,1942 ), P.Eng., Banff School of Advanced Management 1967. and SFU ( Mandarin Studies) at age 73.

His love of the outdoors translated into a lifetime of working as a volunteer with young people in the school systems as " Cougar " teaching Wilderness Survival, and he only hung up his Kayak, Hiking Boots and Skis in 2005!

He was a founding member of the 48th West Vancouver Guild until his passing and enthusiastically participated in all our events. We shall miss him!

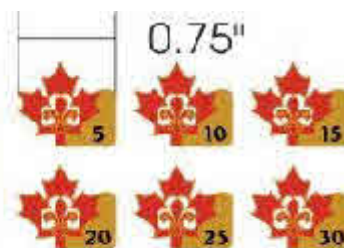
